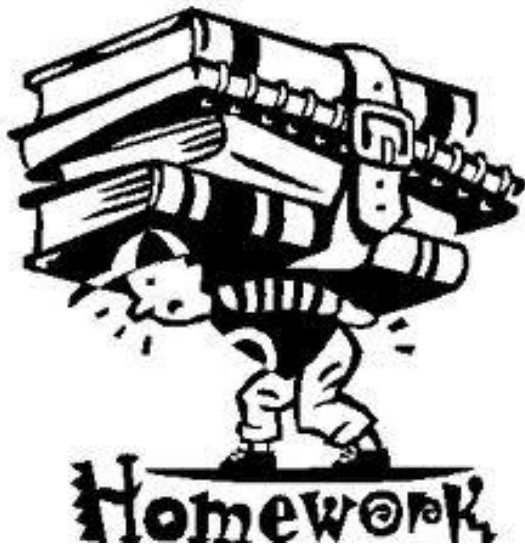

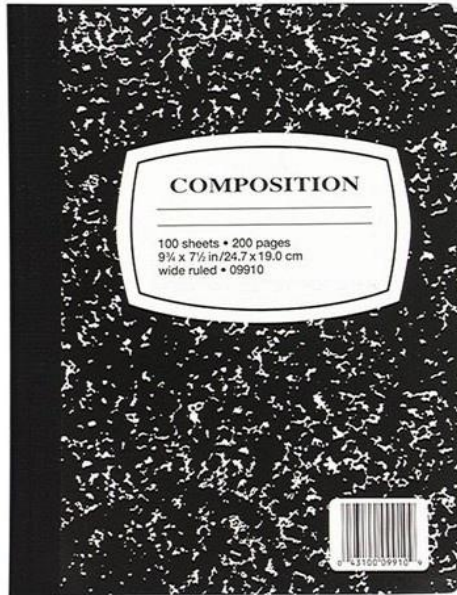

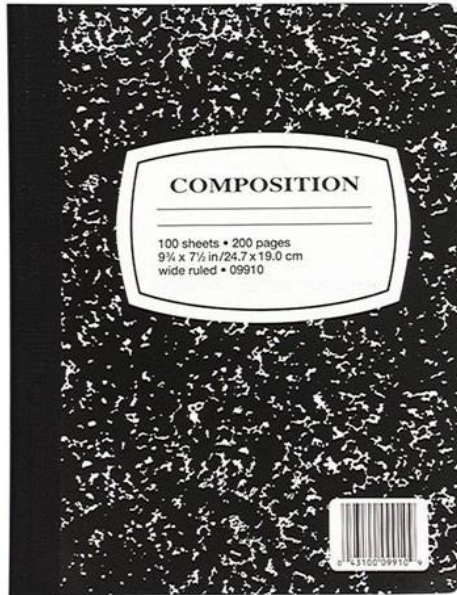

# The Day Before FCAT...

## T A K E N O T E S

- Alliteration = repeated sounds (fast and furious)
- Onomatopoeia = words that sound like their meaning (bark, meow)
- Simile = comparison that uses like or as (Bob is like a tiger)
- Metaphor = comparison that does not use like or as (Bob is a tiger)
- Personification = giving non-living objects human traits (the flowers danced)
- Hyperbole = an exaggeration (Bob was faster than a gazelle)
- Paradox = a contradiction (Bob was the fastest and slowest runner)
- Irony = when expectation does not meet what happens (Bob, a 20 year old man, bought a lotto ticket and died)
