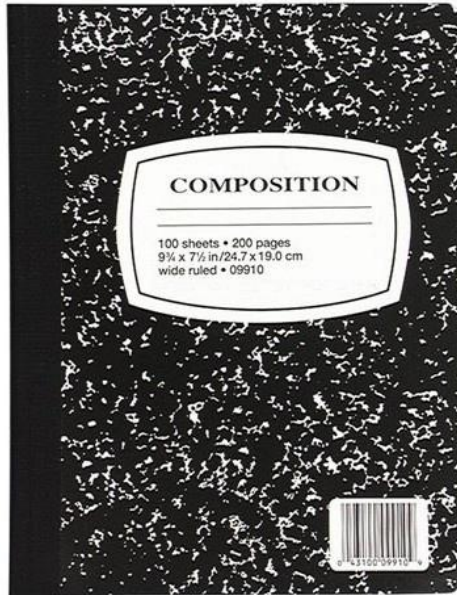

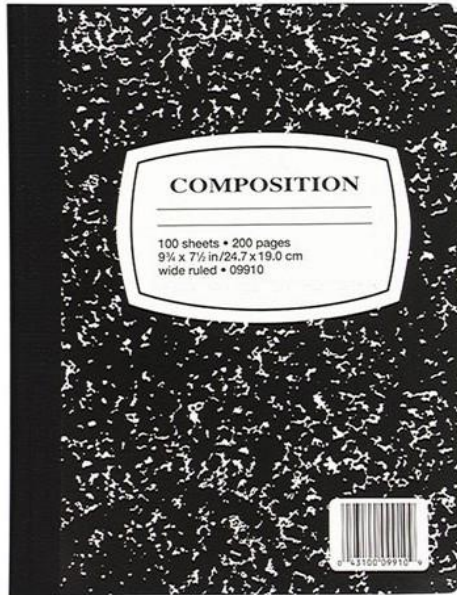

Act I Vocabulary

T A K E N O T E S

- Junta = power given to a military group
- Heathen = an unconverted people that do not acknowledge the Christian God.
- “Goody” = title for “Goodwife” or Mrs.



Act I Teaser Summary

T A K E N O T E S

- Betty Parris is in a “coma” for unknown reasons.
- Samuel Parris watches over her and attempts to question Abigail over events that happened in the forest with her friends and Tituba.
- Mr. and Mrs. Putnam arrive.
- Betty “awakens.”
