

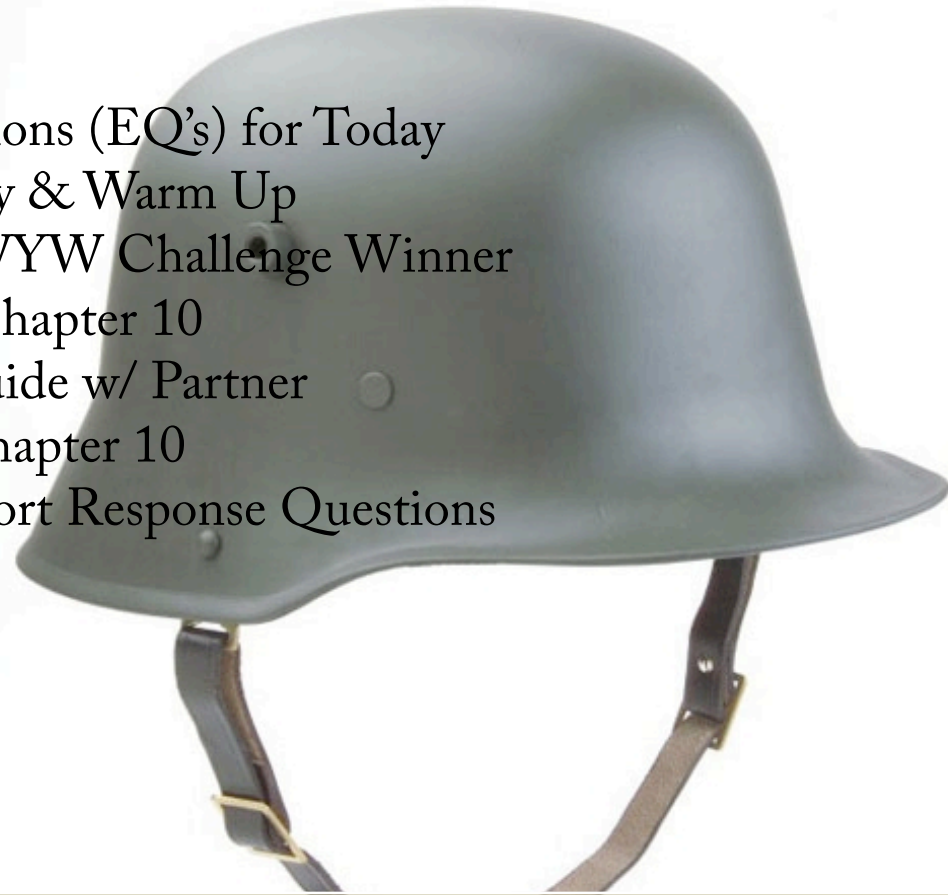

Chapter 9 (“Gone Fishing”)


