### Allusion

- When a book or story is mentioned or used within a book you're currently reading.
- Example: Her garden was as beautiful as Eden.
  - → allusion to The Garden of Eden (Biblical)

## Allusion

Today we'll have an allusion to a man named Lazarus—anyone know who that is?

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- Now a man named Lazarus was sick. He was from Bethany, the village of Mary and her sister Martha. 2 This Mary, whose brother Lazarus now lay sick, was the same one who poured perfume on the Lord and wiped his feet with her hair. 3 So the sisters sent word to Jesus, "Lord, the one you love is sick."
- 4 When he heard this, Jesus said, "This sickness will not end in death. No, it is for God's glory so that God's Son may be glorified through it." 5 Jesus loved Martha and her sister and Lazarus. 6 Yet when he heard that Lazarus was sick, he stayed where he was two more days.

## **Lazarus (John 11:1-44)**

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- 17 On his arrival, Jesus found that Lazarus had already been in the tomb for four days. 18Bethany was less than two miles from Jerusalem, 19 and many Jews had come to Martha and Mary to comfort them in the loss of their brother. 20 When Martha heard that Jesus was coming, she went out to meet him, but Mary stayed at home.
- 21 "Lord," Martha said to Jesus, "if you had been here, my brother would not have died. 22 But I know that even now God will give you whatever you ask."
- 23 Jesus said to her, "Your brother will rise again."

# **Lazarus (John 11:1-44)**

■ 38 Jesus, once more deeply moved, came to the tomb. It was a cave with a stone laid across the entrance. 39 "Take away the stone," he said.

■ 41 So they took away the stone. Then Jesus looked up and said, "Father, I thank you that you have heard me. 42 I knew that you always hear me, but I said this for the benefit of the people standing here, that they may believe that you sent me."

• 43 When he had said this, Jesus called in a loud voice, "Lazarus, come out!" 44 The dead man came out, his hands and feet wrapped with strips of linen, and a cloth around his face.


# **Lazarus (John 11:1-44)**

■ Lazarus = A story about a man who is resurrected (rises again)

### Chapter 10 ("Speaker for the Dead")



### Chapter 12 ("Lazarus")

Joe remembers a day in the war when a German crossed the line and was killed. They nickname the dead soldier Lazarus.


