




- I have selected <u>5 books</u> which I consider to be prime examples of 1950s (and beyond) literature.


A Separate Peace

- About a boy who visits his old preparatory school where a traumatic event happens.




Bless Me, Ultima

- About a boy who gets kicked out of his preparatory school and must live on his own.




The Bell Jar

- A man, Joe Bonham, fought in World War I and was severely injured.
- He is alive, but is paralyzed; he has no legs, arms, eyes, jaw, ears, nose, etc.
- □ He can feel pain.

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
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- He is trapped in his body; the reader hears his thoughts.
