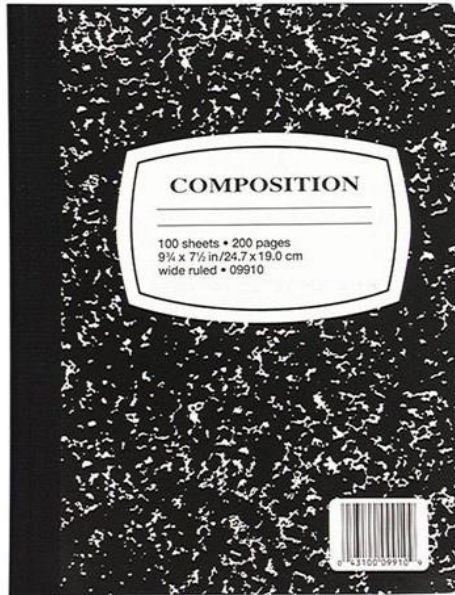

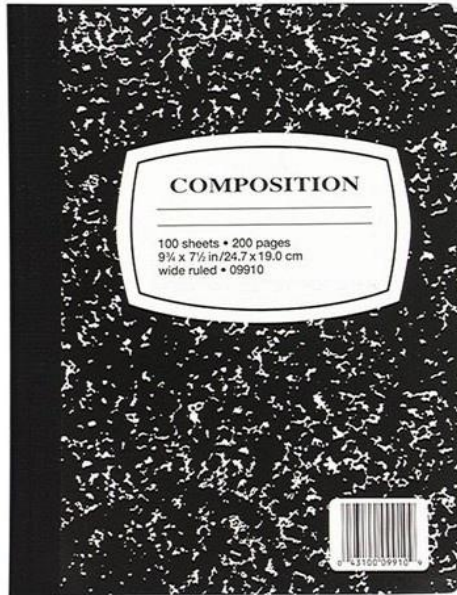

Conclusion Paragraph

- Is your chance to wrap things up
- Nothing *new* necessarily needs to be said
- Your counterpoint paragraph *can* be your conclusion

Must Haves:

- Transitions
- Briefly restated reasons
- Zinger and/or question (is a bonus)

Zinger

- Is a witty statement and/or quote that is relevant to your topic

Examples:

- P.T. Barnum: “There’s a sucker born every minute.”
- “The only place you’ll find work before success is in the dictionary”
- “War doesn’t determine who is right...only who is left.”

Question

- Is a question statement meant to make the reader think

Example:

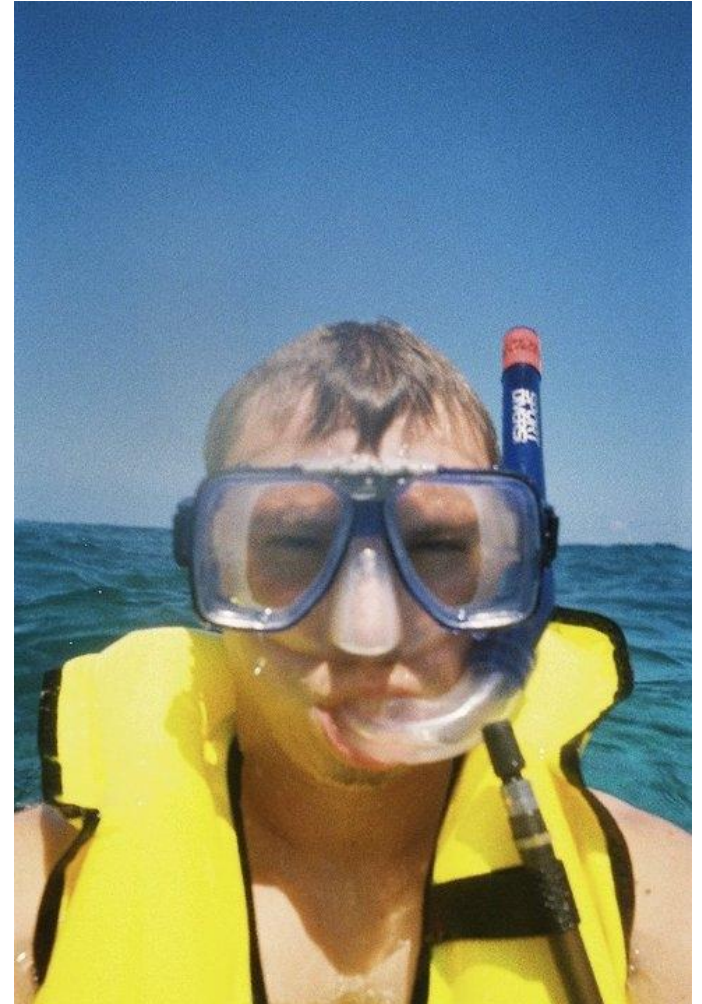
- “By allowing _____, can we afford to continue to let this happen?”

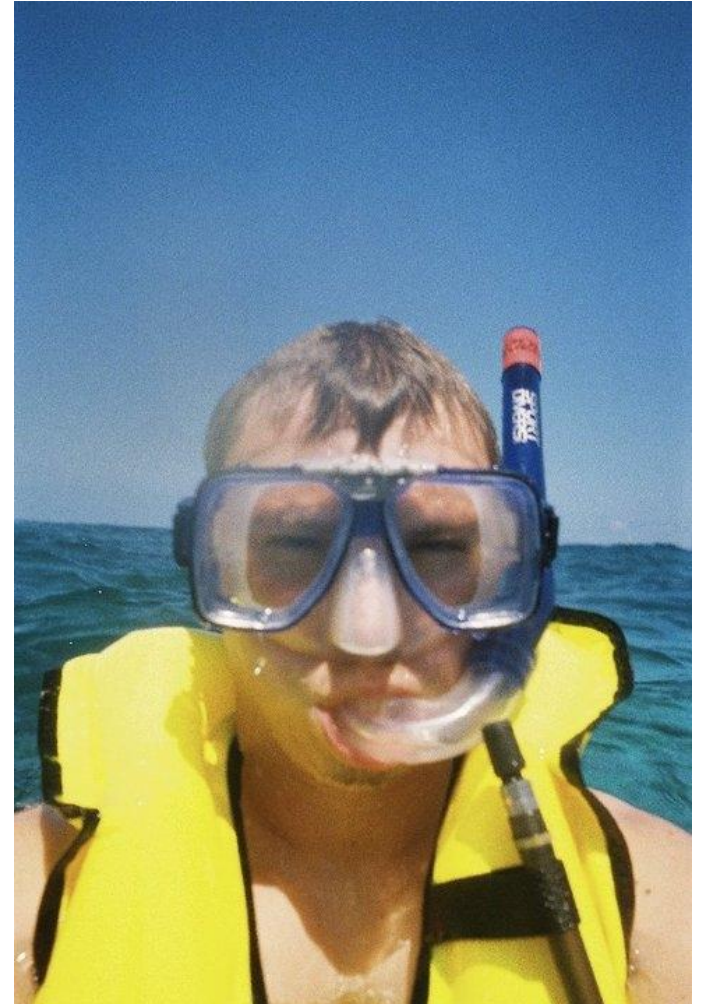
