## Example:

## PROSE

## PLAY

GIRL: [walks into the room]
Is anyone there?
Silence
GIRL: [breathing heavy]

## Project: Prose to Play

## Directions/Tips:

- Give all your group members their own section of the book to write a prose to poetry conversion; having 2 people work together is okay as well, but remember to use all 4 group members!
$\square$ Have group members begin hand writing their conversions.
$\square$ Remember to pick out what you/your group consider to be important; not every part of the story should make it into the conversion.
- There is no length requirement; but a conversion should be at least 5 handwritten pages.
- You have 50 minutes; but it is not "due" today; you will turn it in, and if Hampton likes what he sees, you'll be finishing it on Monday.
