



- Each area your character has must be filled in.
- Each area must have quotational support from the play!
- I will give your group a sheet with this information!

- 1. Brain: what makes this person "tick"; think what motivates/drives this person to action?
- 2. Eyes: visions, goals, hopes, and dreams; who/what did this person see for themselves in the future?
- 3. Mouth: Three quotes by this person that *define* who they are in the play.
- 4. Left hand: actions performed by or tools used by this character that are important to who they are.
- 5. Hands: actions performed by or tools used by this character that are important to who they are.
- 6. "Achilles heel": who/what was this person's weakness?
- 7. Roots: what/who influenced this person in the play?
