





- 3. Why do you think Trumbo wrote Johnny Got His Gun?






Chapter 1


Chapter 3

Joe's left arm is amputated (cut off). He then remembers the wedding ring on it. He has a flashback to his last night with Kareen (girlfriend) before the joining the war. He loses both of his arms.




Chapter 4 ("Girlfriends")

Joe remembers when he worked with his friend Howie because their girlfriends cheated on them. Joe punched his best friend, Bill Harper because Bill told Joe about the cheating. Walking by his ex's house, Joe finds her kissing someone: Bill Harper.




Chapter 6 ("Jose")

- Joe remembers back to working in the bakery from Ch. 1. He works with a man named Jose. A woman is in love with Jose. Jose attempts to get fired.
- Joe wakes up in real life and realizes he is alone.




Chapter 7 ("The Rat")

Joe ponders the realities of war. He begins to feel parts of his injured body. A rat crawls over Joe and starts eating him—night after night.




Chapter 9 ("Gone Fishing")

Joe remembers back to a fishing trip with his father. He wants to spend time with Bill Harper instead of his father. Joe loses his father's fishing rod, which is his father's most prized possession.




Chapter 10 ("Speaker for the Dead")

Joe thinks about what the word *war* means to him. He realizes that people who have fought and died for their country cannot speak about it because they are dead; Joe vows to become a "speaker for the dead."




Chapter 12 ("Lazarus")

Joe remembers a day in the war when a German crossed the line and was killed. They nickname the dead soldier Lazarus.




Chapter 16 ("Jesus Chris")

- Joe has learned to tap his head in Morse Code—he learned this in Chapter 13.
- Joe has a dream/flashback (?) in which he talks with Jesus and other "dead" soldiers.




Chapter 17 ("The Nurse")

- After tapping S.O.S. for *years*, Joe is about to give up, until he gets a new nurse. This nurse communicates with Joe
- This is his first contact with the outside world since his accident.




Chapter 18 ("What do you want?")

The nurse finally understands what Joe is doing and brings in officers to communicate with Joe in Morse Code.




Chapter 19 ("What I Want")

Joe communicates what he wants more than anything to the Doctors: *freedom*.



Chapter 20 ("The Reply")

Joe receives his reply: No. Joe then ponders what to do with the rest of his life.



Additionally, what do you think Trumbo is trying to say about real war through his writing?
 - Use details from the story to support your answer. Please remember you can use your book during this exam and are encouraged to do so; use quotes from the story to support your answer! Excellent responses should mention at least 3-4 chapters with quotes from the story.
