Concrete vs. Abstract Nouns

- Concrete: things you can SEE directly.
 - Ex: car, Mr. Hampton, air, water
- Abstract: things that cannot be seen unless reflected in another object.
 - Ex: honor, loyalty, charity, happiness

Pronouns vs. Antecedents

Pronoun: takes the place of a noun
Ex: Mr. Hampton --> "he"
Antecedent: the noun that has been substituted.
Ex: "Mr. Hampton gave his stereo away." *antecedent* p.n.

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Action vs. Linking Verbs

- Action verbs: show what action someone or something is doing.
 - Ex: The telephone <u>rings</u> all day long.
- Linking verbs: connects the subject with another word or describes the subject.
 - Ex: His forehand <u>feels</u> cold.
 - Ex: Milk <u>turns</u> bad very quickly.
