### Compare & Contrast

- Compare = similarities (how is it the same?)
- Contrast = differences (how is it different?)

## Venn Diagram

- Venn Diagram = two circles that overlap in the middle.
  - Differences in separate circles
  - Similarities in the center

# Clip: Vantage Point

- This movie is about one event...the shooting of the President.
- This clip will show different points of view (POV) for this one event.
- Remember, POV is about looking at the story through a character's eyes—what they see, think, experience, etc.
  - 1st POV = A news reporter
  - 2nd POV = A secret service agent

# Stories: Flipped & Diving Under

- This story is about one event…a boy and girl growing up together.
- This story will show different points of view (POV) for this one event.
- Remember, POV is about looking at the story through a character's eyes—what they see, think, experience, etc.
  - 1st POV = What the boy thinks about the girl
  - 2nd POV = What the girl thinks about the boy
