## **Group Work Trial!**

- x As a group, must decide what the correct answer is and why the others are incorrect.
- ➤ For each answer choice, a 1 sentence description is required—tell me why one answer is correct and why the other three are wrong.

## Example

• Question 1: "In the movie *Labyrinth*, the conflict is:"

- On your paper:
  - × A: *The dog barking*. This answer is incorrect because the dog barking wasn't a problem in the story.
  - ➤ B: *The Goblin King*. This answer is correct because the whole problem of the story is about Sara's baby brother being taken away by the Goblin King.
  - ▼ C: *The owl*. This answer is incorrect because the owl does nothing in the beginning of the story, so it is not a problem.
  - ➤ D: *The step-mother*. This answer is incorrect because her step-mother is a problem, but it's not the major problem in the story. She never even shows back up in the story.

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### • Rules:

- × No talking aloud.
- × Use your other sheets of paper to communicate with your group member.

- Read the questions first.
- × Re-read the story.
- ➤ Communicate with your partner—agree on an answer.
- × Write it down on your sheet of paper.
