“Graveyard” FCA Review



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- Purpose: To understand what makes an answer correct and the other three answers incorrect.
- Directions:
 - ✦ Get in groups of 2
 - ✦ Take out a few sheets of paper for your group
 - ✦ You will be assigned 3 questions from the FCA.
 - ✦ As a group, must decide what the correct answer is and why the others are incorrect.
 - ✦ For each answer choice, a 1 sentence description is required—tell me why one answer is correct and why the other three are wrong.

Example



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- Question 1: “In the movie *Labyrinth*, the conflict is:”
- On your paper:
 - ✦ A: *The dog barking*. This answer is incorrect because the dog barking wasn’t a problem in the story.
 - ✦ B: *The Goblin King*. This answer is correct because the whole problem of the story is about Sara’s baby brother being taken away by the Goblin King.
 - ✦ C: *The owl*. This answer is incorrect because the owl does nothing in the beginning of the story, so it is not a problem.
 - ✦ D: *The step-mother*. This answer is incorrect because her step-mother is a problem, but it’s not the major problem in the story. She never even shows back up in the story.

“Graveyard” FCA Review



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- Rules:
 - ✦ No talking aloud.

 - ✦ Read the questions first.
 - ✦ Re-read the story.
 - ✦ Communicate with your partner—agree on an answer.
 - ✦ Write it down on your sheet of paper.

 - ✦ 2 = questions 4, 5, 6
 - ✦ 3 = questions 8, 9, 10
 - ✦ 4 = questions 11, 12, SR1
 - ✦ 5 = questions 13, 14, 15
 - ✦ 6 = questions 1, 2, 3
 - ✦ 7 = questions 4, 5, 6
 - ✦ 8 = questions 8, 9, 10
 - ✦ 9 = questions 1, 2, 3
 - ✦ 10 = questions 13, 14, 15
 - ✦ 11 = questions 11, 12, SR1
 - ✦ 12 = questions 8, 9, 10
 - ✦ 13 = questions 4, 5, 6
 - ✦ 14 = questions 1, 2, 3
