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Review: Fairy Tale Project

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Fairy Tale Project



Getting started:

- ❑ Discuss the following:
 - ❑ What is our story going to be about? What will be our plot, characters, and moral be?

 - ❑ What if one of us is absent—who is going to work on the project?
 - ❑ What is our plan for today? What are we going to work on: artwork or the story?
