- Three types:

1. Coordinating
but, and, or, so, yet

2. Correlative
either...or, neither...nor, both...and

3. Subordinating
after, as, because, since, if, than, until

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Interjections



- Interjection = word that expresses strong feeling; usually has no grammatical connection.
 - ✦ *Oh, wow, well, ouch, dear, aha, alas*

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McCarthyism & The Red Scare



- 1940-1950
- Fear of communism by the Soviet Union
- Thousands of accused of being communists



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McCarthyism & The Red Scare



- Senator McCarthy
- Claimed to have 205 names of Communists working for the Government.
- Led to thousands being accused of being a communist.



McCarthyism & The Red Scare



- Hollywood 10
- Members of Hollywood accused of being communists.



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McCarthyism & The Red Scare



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- Arthur Miller
- 1953: Wrote *The Crucible* about fear of communism spreading.
- 1956: Testified before Congress about Hollywood's involvement in communism.
- Refused to give the names:
 - *“I could not use the name of another person and bring trouble on him.”*
- Blacklisted from Hollywood until 1958.
