
Whitman

- Walt Whitman = Uncle Walt
- **1819-1892**
- Father of "free verse poetry"
- Best known for his collection of poems, *Leaves of Grass*



Leaves of Grass

- Published 1855
- Written in free-verse (non-rhyming) poetry.
- Walt's brother said it "wasn't worth reading."
- Emerson wrote a positive 5-page review; led to mass publication.



TAKE NOTES

Leaves of Grass

- The book was not without controversy
- Geologist John Lesley wrote that the book was "trashy" and "profane"; he also called Emerson a "pretentious ass."

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

RAFT

□ Stands for:

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- 1. <u>R</u>ole: who are you?
- 2. <u>A</u>udience: who you are writing to?
- 3. <u>Format: what kind of writing?</u>
- 4. <u>T</u>opic: your subject?

RAFT Example

Example from *The Crucible*:

Role: Proctor

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- □ Audience: Abigail
- Format: Letter
- □ Topic: "What I think about you"

Dear Abigail,

I think you are a lying, gossiping "whore." You need to leave my family, especially my wife, alone! I know I had "relations" with you once, but that's no excuse to go around accusing everyone of witchcraft...
