Mr. Hampton's Fix-Up Strategies Cheat Sheet

Are you confused when you read? Do you read something and then don't remember anything that you've read? Try one or a few of these "fix-up" strategies!

Confused about the passage?

- 1. Re-read: a sentence, a paragraph, or the whole story.
- 2. <u>Visualize</u>: imagine a movie playing in your head as you read.
- 3. Re-tell: tell another person what you just read. If you're taking a test, stop and ask yourself, "What did I just read?" Stop every paragraph, or when you need to!
- 4. Speed up or slow down: good readers know when they can speed through an easy passage, or when they need to slow down for a difficult one!

Bored while reading the passage?

- 5. Make a connection: get involved in the story! Have you or someone you know gone through a similar situation?
- 6. Make a prediction: what do you think will happen next in the story?
