

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

<u>Time</u>

- Time is our biggest enemy.
- 180 school days of "learning," minus
 - FCA = 8x
 - Demand Writing = 4x
 - Benchmark Exam = 2x
 - FAIR = 2x
 - FCAT Writes = 1 day

<u>Time</u>

 - G''Socratic Circles"

<u>Class / Yes</u>

- Used to get class attention.
 - I say "Class"
 - You say "Yes?" and stop talking immediately.

Eyes on Me / The Board

- Used to direct class attention.
 - "On Me" = Look at Hampton
 - "On The Board" = Look at board

<u>Commands for Doing</u>

- "Snaps" = Go
- Always wait for "snaps"
- Move commands = must move desk into correct formation
