Why Study Vocabulary?

- 1. Size of vocabulary = academic and career success
- 2. Difficult text = difficult words; more vocabulary results in easier time reading difficult text.
- 3. More than 95% of words in English come from common roots; knowing 50 roots = over 100,000 new words.



Prefixes, Suffixes, Roots

- Prefix = placed before "stem" of word
- Root word = the "stem"
- Suffix = placed after the "stem of a word"


