





- Has large family (opposite of Goody Putnam)
- Well-respected in the community
- Involved in a number of land disputes with the Putnams
- Later accused of witchcraft and convicted



Character Log: Giles Corey

- 81 years old
- Married 4 times (husband of Martha Corey)
- Farmer and large land owner
- Also accused and convicted of witchcraft by the Putnams
- Did not confess or deny witchcraft charges


