

Verb Tenses

- "Bob *cook* a pizza every day since 1995" OR
- "Bob has cooked a pizza every day since 1995"
- Verb tenses tell you:
 - What action took place
 - When that action took place
- Two types of verbs:
 - Regular
 - Irregular



Verb Tenses

Regular Verbs (like *cook*):

Present: cook

Past: cooked

Future: will cook

Present perfect: has cooked

Past perfect: had cooked

Future perfect: will have cooked



Verb Tenses

<u>Irregular Verbs (like to be):</u>

Present: is

Past: was

Future: will be

Present perfect: has been

Past perfect: had been

Future perfect: will have been



Verb Shifting

- SAT loves to shift verbs; you find the error in shifting
 - "By 4:00, all the bushes had been pruned and the grass was mowed."
 - Should be "had been pruned" and "had been mowed"
- Every verb in a sentence does not have to be in the same tense...more on this next week!
 - Henry lost (past) a \$20 that has now been found (present perfect)


