The Beat Generation

- 1950s
- Beat = "upbeat" or "on the beat"
- Refers to a group of post World War II writers who experimented with:
 - Drugs
 - Alternate forms of sexuality
 - Adoption of eastern religion
 - Rejection of materialism
- Influenced by Romanticism (love of nature, power of individual)
- Later called "beatnik's" → gave rise to Hippie generation



The Hippie Generation

- 1960s
- "beatnik" → "hippie" (hipster)
- Beliefs include those from Beat Generation, plus:
 - Health food
 - Embraced sexual revolution
 - Use of LSD / Mushrooms for altered state of consciousness
- Well known for "Woodstock" in 1969 and creation of peace symbol



Ken Kesey

- **1935 2001**
- The link between Beat and Hippie generations
- In 1964: traveled with his friends, the Merry Pranksters, in a psychedelic school bus named "Furthur"
 - Threw parties called "Acid tests"
- 1959: wrote One Flew Over while working the nightshift in a hospital (sometimes under the influence of drugs)
 - Kesey believed patients weren't "insane," but ostracized by society





Project MKULTRA

- **1953**
- Code name for the CIA's illegal human experimentation of psychoactive drugs on people
 - Ken Kesey a member
- Working at a mental institution + drugs = One Flew Over
- Shut down in mid-1960s
 - Project MKSEARCH → attempt to find "truth" drug for Cold War spies
