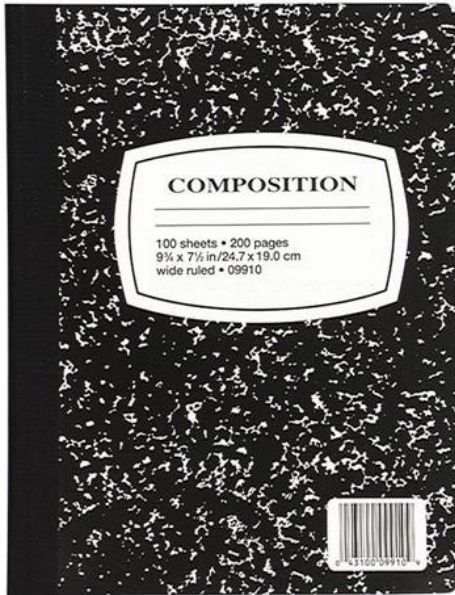

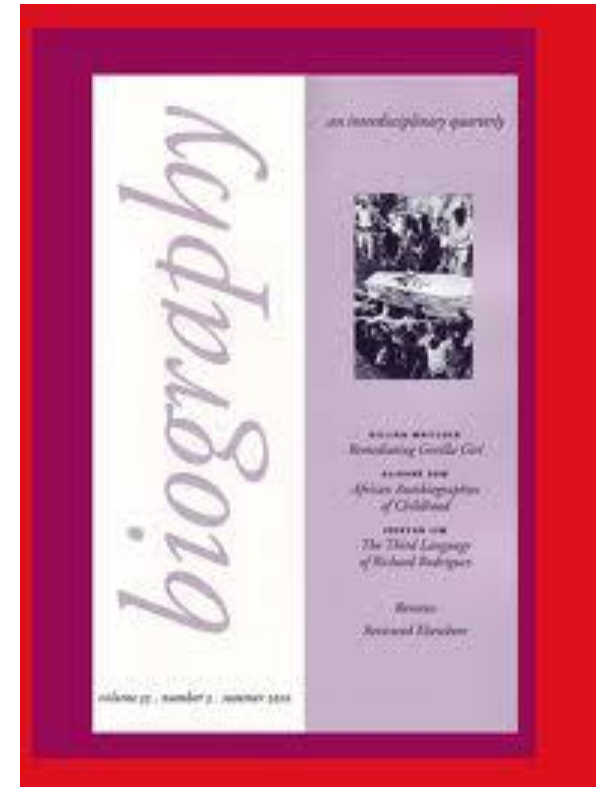

Biographical Criticism

T A K E N O T E S

- Assumes there is a relationship between:
 - The book
 - The author's life
- Positives: most author's lives "bleed into" their works:
 - Tennessee Williams (*Streetcar Named Desire*)
 - Arthur Miller (*Crucible*)
 - Ken Kesey (*One Flew Over...*)
 - Amy Tan (*Two Kinds*)
- Negatives: author's like to branch out from own life experiences:
 - Ken Follett (*Pillars of the Earth*)
 - Orson Scott Card (*Ender's Game*)



Feminist (Gender) Criticism

T A K E N O T E S

- Is about equal representation of gender in literature
- Positives:
 - Females are often under-represented
 - Nathaniel Hawthorne: “damned mob of scribbling women”
 - Many books have sexist ideologies (thoughts of negativity towards any sex) and gender biases
- Negatives: might miss “larger picture” (*Crucible*)

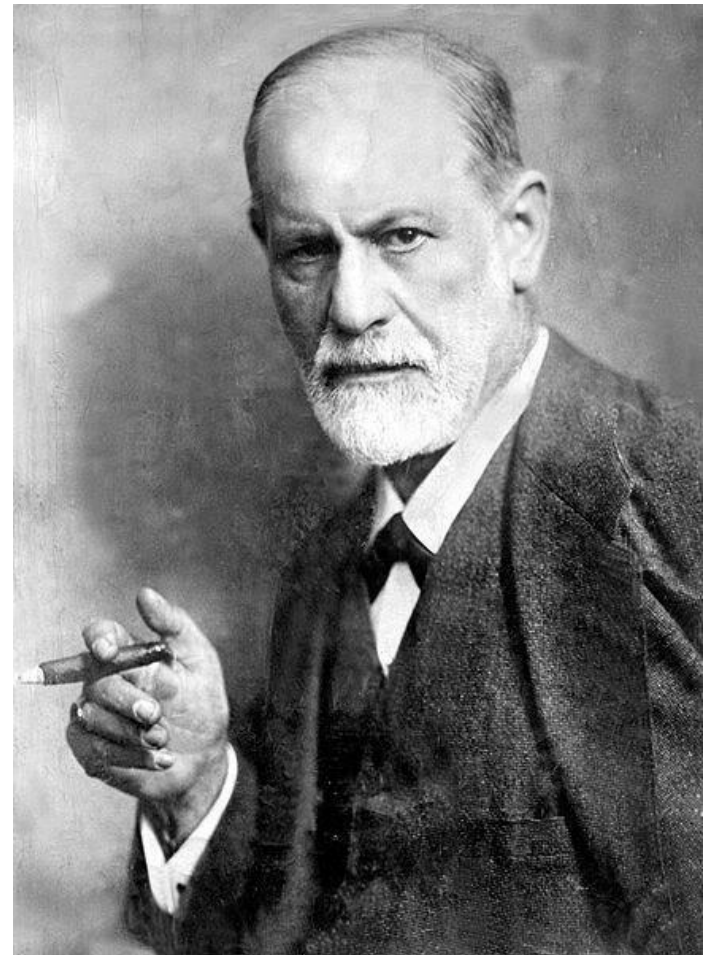

Psychological Criticism

T A K E N O T E S

- Is about analyzing the human mind and/or behavior in literature
- Positives:
 - Characters are complex beings
 - Any kind of “theory” can be used (Pavlov, Skinner, Jung, Freud)
 - Gain knowledge about human behavior that can be applied to us, the reader.
- Negatives: “Sometimes a cigar is just a cigar”



Character Log: *Acutes vs. Chronics*

Acutes:

- Less serious mental illnesses
- Most characters come from this group
 - Martini, Billy Bibbit, Tabor, Scalon, McMurphy, etc.
- Participate in “group therapy”



Chronics:

- More serious mental illnesses
- Mostly vegetables, but:
 - Does include “The Chief”
