

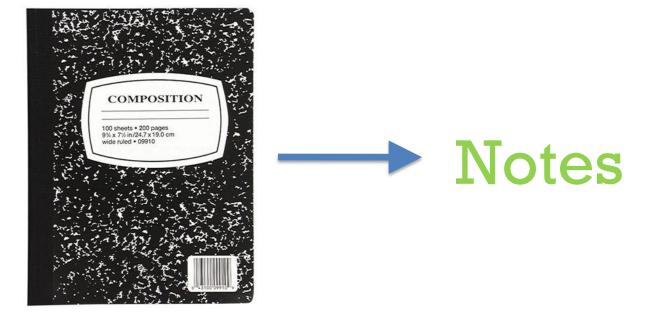

AICE Language Exam



 - A Directed Writing Task (B)







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
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Verb Tenses

- "Bob cook a pizza every day since 1995" OR
- "Bob has cooked a pizza every day since 1995"
- Verb tenses tell you:
 - What action took place
 - When that action took place
- Two types of verbs:
 - Regular
 - Irregular



Verb Shifting

- SAT loves to shift verbs; you find the error in shifting
 - "By 4:00, all the bushes had been pruned and the grass was mowed."
 - Should be "had been pruned" and "had been mowed"
- Every verb in a sentence does not have to be in the same tense...more on this next week!
 - Henry lost (past) a \$20 that has now been found (present perfect)



Verb Shifting REDUX

<u>Ask yourself:</u>

- Is the shift present because there are two different time periods in the story?
 - Yes = can have verb tense shifts
 - No = sentence must be correct
- Example:
 - YES = Henry **lost** a \$20 that **has now been** found.
 - NO = At the same time I was losing hope, a stranger jumps off of a boat and swims towards me.

Practice: Verb Tense Shifting

Correct the errors in shifting, if present:

- 1. English colonists who settled in Massachusetts receive assistance from the Indians.
- 2. In 1675, Phillip leads the Wamponoag tribe in a series of attacks on colonial settlements.
- 3. This attack, later known as King Phillip's War, raged on for over a year and leaves three thousand Indians dead.
- 4. Mrs. Rowland, a survivor of the war, is a minister's wife who was kidnapped and holds captive for several days.
- 5. Although it does not tell a complete story, Rowland's narrative showed its author to be a keen observer.
