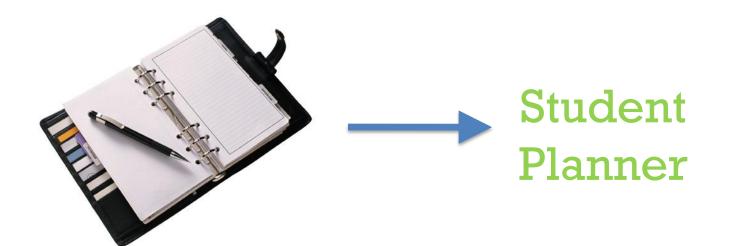





#### The Three Acts

- Like magic acts, short stories typically have three components:
  - 1. The Pledge: author presents something ordinary—a person, and object, a situation
  - 2. The Turn: author changes that ordinary something into something extraordinary
  - 3. The Prestige: end result is a changed outlook by the reader on that something




#### The Three Acts: Harry Potter

- 1. The Pledge: Harry Potter, an ordinary boy
- 2. The Turn: Harry Potter really a wizard
- 3. The Prestige: Harry Potter willing to sacrifice himself to save others



#### The Three Acts: Stranger Than Fiction

- 1. The Pledge: Harold Crick, an ordinary (boring) guy
- 2. The Turn: Harold can hear the narrator; will die?
- 3. The Prestige:?
