




Electro-Shock Therapy (EST / ECT)

- Also known as the "shock shop" or Electro-Convulsive Therapy
- Subject is strapped down, electrodes are placed on head, and subject is given electrically-induced seizures.
- In theory, disrupts brain signals responsible for many disorders
- Treatment is repetitive since effect lasts a short time
- Still used today!



<u>Lobotomy</u>

- Surgeon cuts connections to and from the brain via an "icepick" up the nasal cavity.
- Most popular with extreme behavior cases (1930-1950s)
- Used seldom after 1950s due to creation of drugs (Thorazine) having the same effect
