

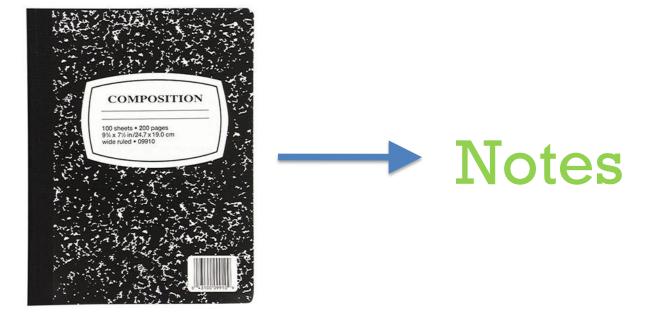






The Power of Characters

- Offer judgments about situations, other characters
- Speak
- Act
- Interact
- React



Building Believable Characters

- Base a character off of yourself
- Base a character off of a person you know
- Make a composite (mash up) character based off of multiple people you know
- Random people you come in contact with (ex, the man on the bus!)
- Be inspired by a picture, quote, etc.

Ekphrastic Story Building

- Ekphrastic = "to speak about a thing, person, or experience"
