

Sentence Issues

What's wrong with these?

- "An old stool in the corner."
- "Immediately stopped singing."
- Grammatically correct? NO
- Why? SENTENCE FRAGMENTS (not complete sentences)
 - Groups of words that pretend to be sentences
- Sentences must contain:
 - Subject
 - Verb

Fragments

To repair "Fragment":

- Make fragment into its own sentence (add noun/verb)
 - "I saw an old stool in the corner."
- Pull the fragment into a nearby sentence, usually joining with a comma
 - "I looked around. An old stool in the corner." --> "Looking around, I spotted an old stool in the corner."

Run-Ons

- Run-Ons are sentences that have not been joined correctly
 - FUSED: "Smiling is a means of communication it is essential for good health."
 - COMMA SPLICE: "Smiling is a means of communication, it is essential for good health."
- Run-Ons can be corrected by:
 - A comma used with a conjunction (and, or, but, so, yet)
 - A semi-colon (;) or colon (:)
- Correct: "Smiling is a means of communication, and it is essential for good health."
- Correct: "Smiling is a means of communication; it is essential for good health."


