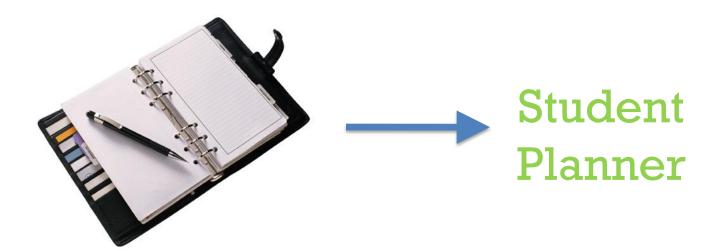



Misplaced Modifiers / Participles

What's wrong with these?

- "The house stood on the corner which was painted red."
- "Running to class, the bell rang before Jack arrived."
- Answer? Both have something misplaced
- "The house, which was painted red, stood on the corner."
- "Running to class, Jack heard the bell ring..."



Misplaced Modifiers

- A modifier "modifies" the subject of the sentence
 - "Eagerly anticipating her birthday, Mary's presents sat in the room."
- Two kinds:
 - Adjective modifiers ("The pretty girl.")
 - Adverb modifiers ("He ran quickly.")
- Goal: put modifiers as close as possible to what they are modifying
 - "Eagerly anticipating her birthday, Mary looked at her presents in her room."

Dangling Participles

- A participle is a verb ending in -ing that modifies a noun or pronoun
 - "Floating in the pool, the clouds passed by"
- Issue: no proper subject can be determined
- Goal: insert subject or make subject clearer
 - "Floating in the pool, I watched the clouds pass by"

Misplaced Modifiers / Participles
