
# SSHTT Style

- Begin with a graphic explanation that relates to your topic
  - Sight, smell, hearing, touch, taste
- Very similar to story creation, except only done in first few sentences



## **Funnel Style**

 Begin with talking about topic generally, then progress to something more specific



### <u>Quotation Style</u>

- Begin with relevant quote to topic
- Can make up quote (to a certain degree)—"A wise man once said…"



### Anecdote Style

 Begin with a short or amusing story about a person or situation that relates to topic choice



## **Question Style**

 Begin with a question, or questions, that lead into your topic
