



  - "Your company and its potential are of great value to me."



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
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### Parallel Structure

#### When To Use Parallel Structure:

- 1. Elements joined by a conjunction
  - Your company and its (what its)
     potential (is) are of great value
- 2. Elements are in a list or series
  - The tribes emphasized survival, mutual aid, and (being) responsibility.
- 3. If elements are being compared
  - I like swimming more than (to dive) diving.
- 4. If elements are joined by a linking verb
  - To succeed is to open a new opportunity.
