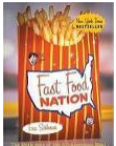

- ❑ Return to text; where is your answer coming from?



# FCAT vs. FCAT 2.0 vs. PARCC

## **FCAT**

- ☐ 2001-2011
- ☐ Paper-based
- ☐ Lower complexity
- ☐ 40% fiction / 60% non-fiction



## **FCAT 2.0**

- ☐ 2012-2013
- ☐ Computer-based
- ☐ Higher complexity
- ☐ 30% fiction / 70% non-fiction

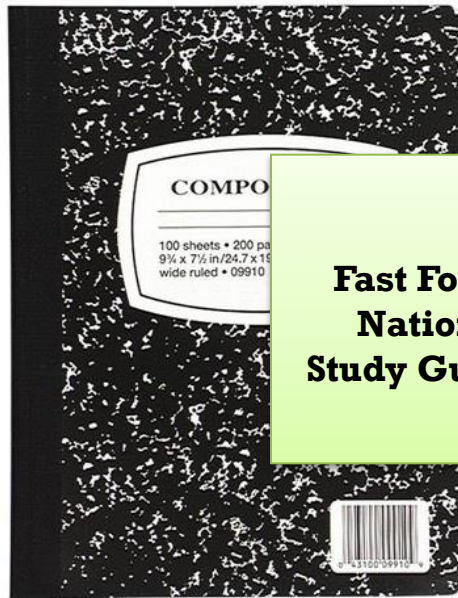


## **PARCC**

- ☐ 2014-?
- ☐ Computer-based
- ☐ Highest complexity (public domain texts); two passages paired together
- ☐ 20% fiction / 80% non-fiction
