



Veggie-Libel Laws

- Mentioned in Food, Inc.
- Makes it easier for food companies to sue critics who make statements about their products:
 - Oprah (1996): made comments about "mad cow" disease; was sued by the beef industry; won after spending \$1 million
 - McD vs. Morris/Steel (1997):
 made pamphlet against McD;
 was sued; lost (McLibel case)



What's wrong with McDonald's?



Everything they don't want you to know.

"Cheeseburger Bill"

- "Personal responsibility in food consumption act"
- Protects producers and retailers (like McD) from being sued for negative effects of eating their food
 - Made famous in Supersize Me (the two obese girls who sued McD)
- Passed in House of Representatives; failed in Senate



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
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Obesity

- Defined as excess body fat
 - Reduced life expectancy
 - Increased health problems
- Related to BMI (Body Mass Index)
- Ratio of height to weight
 - BMI 30-35 = Obese
 - BMI 35-40 = Morbid Obesity
 - BMI 40+ = Super Obesity



Obesity & Fast Food Addiction


- Body craves three things, not easily found in nature:
 - 1. Fat
 - 2. Salt
 - 3. Sugar
- Fast food typically provides are three in a meal (burger, fries, soda)
- Leads to many people being unable to break their addiction.
