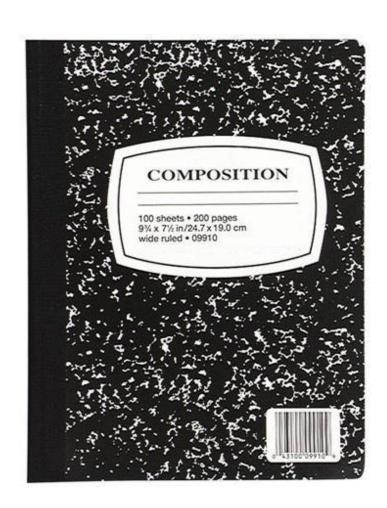

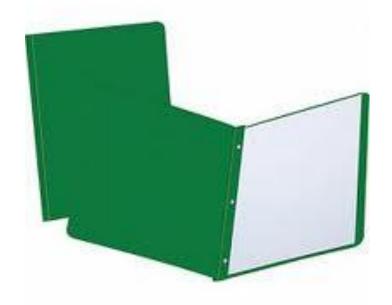

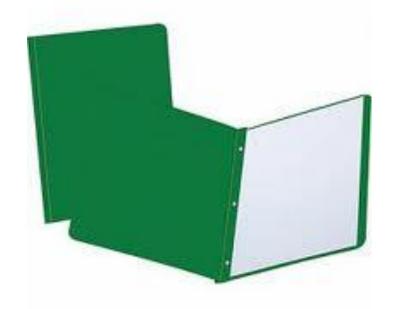

The Hampton System

- Manages the behavior of the entire class

 - 18 weeks



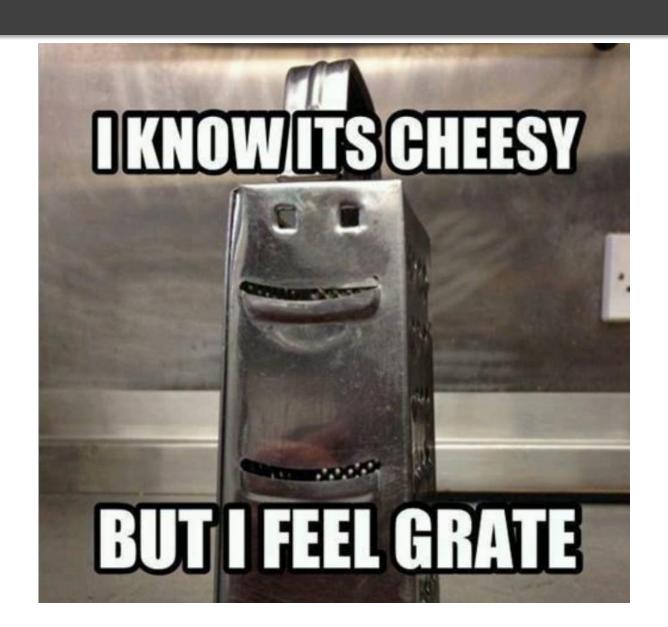
Class / Yes
