

## **Transition**





#### Advanced Photography Techniques

- Candid > posed photography
- Tell a story or capture a moment
- "Elements" of a photograph make it more visually appealing
- Example:
  - Sport photography: moments of action, reaction (win/loss)



#### Rule of Thirds

- Position camera so center of interest is off center
- Focus on upper/lower or left/right



#### Center of Interest

- Gives dramatic focus to photo
- Even in crowd, photo should have a focus





# Bokeh / Color Splash







#### **Angle**

- Low angle = makes subject bigger, more powerful
- High angle = make subject smaller, less powerful





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#### **Framing**

- Frame occurs before subject
- "Frames" the action or gives context





## Leading Lines

- Real or perceived lines that follow the center of interest
- Can "draw in" or "push away" from subject
