## Active vs. Passive Verb Choice

- "The pumps were destroyed by the fire." OR
- "A fire was responsible for the destruction of the pumps."
- Grammatically correct? YES
- Sounds good?
  - NO because both use passive verbs of to be
- Be, am, is, are, was, were, being, being, been (auxiliary verbs)
- Active verb answer: "A fire destroyed the pumps."
- Avoids using variations of to be

## Active vs. Passive Verb Choice

 Active verbs energize writing, make it more "colorful," and convey action

- Example:
  - A decision was reached by the board
  - The board reached a decision.



In passive sentences, the thing doing the action disappears or is unclear; active sentences emphasize the "doer"
