

- "Every one of the cakes is gone" OR
- "Every one of the cakes are gone"
- A "sentence" = must have both a subject and a verb
 - "I threw the ball"
 - Sub. = "I"
 - Verb = "threw"
- Subjects and verbs must agree with each...singular or plural:
 - "I hit her" vs. "I hits her"
 - "The girl sings well" vs. "The girl sing well"



<u>A few special rules:</u>

- 1. Two subjects connected by "or" / "either" = use singular verb
 - "My mom or dad <u>is arriving</u>"
- 2. Singular subject and plural subject in same sentence = use plural verb
 - The plate or the bowls <u>are used</u> tonight"
- 3. Two subjects connected by "and" = use plural verb
 - "Mom and dad <u>are arriving</u>"

<u>Subject / Verb Agreement</u>

A few special rules:

- 4. Sentence uses "one," "everyone," = use singular verb
 - "Every one of those girls is stupid"
- 5. Money or time = singular verb
 - <u>Three dollars is a lot of money</u>"
- 6. Collective nouns = can use either
 - "<u>The staff is in a meeting</u>"

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
