Format:

- Times New Roman font
- Size 12
- Double-spaced
- 1” margins on all sides
- Follow special rules for 1st page (header, etc.)
- See examples in workbook (under Smartboard)
- Use template on pbworks.com website

Thesis Statement

- A 1-2 sentence opener @ beginning of 1st paragraph
- Has subject, method, message
- Full notes on 1.27.14

First Paragraph Tips

- Recall essay topic: Trace the development of one character from *Streetcar*
- Start with thesis statement:
 - Subject, method, message
- Brief 1-2 sentence summary of text (optional)
- A 1-2 sentence summary of how you plan to support your statement?
 - What parts of the text seem to support your opinion?
 - What trends have you noticed while reading?

First Paragraph Example

- In *A Streetcar Named Desire*, Tennessee Williams uses Stanley Kowalski to show how men are violent and destructive. Williams' play begins with the entrance of Blanche Dubois, sister of Stella, who runs away from her old life at Belle Reve and attempts to live with her sister and Stanley in New Orleans. Unfortunately, things do not turn out exceptionally well for any person. Throughout the play, Stanley is seen as an aggressive, “ape-like” creature (Williams 4.118), not capable of the “tenderness” (Williams 10.44) that Blanche desperately wants.

Body Paragraph Tips

- Use transitional phrases--to begin, in Scene 2, etc.

- Follow this pattern:
 1. Explain idea you have
 2. Cite line from book that supports idea: (Williams 52) or (Williams 4.112)
 3. Explain how line answers idea you had

- Rinse and repeat

- View pgs. 299-303 in workbook
