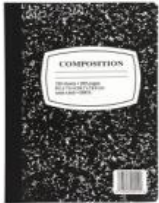

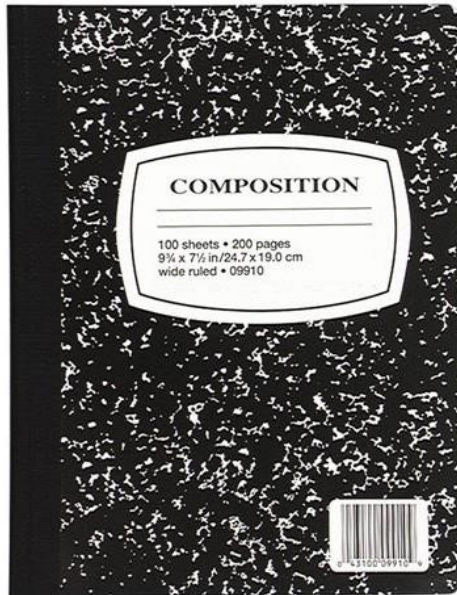

- Refers to color mixing and/or specific color combinations that are pleasing to the eye (“color wheel”)
- Primary color = three colors can be combined to make most other colors; red, green, blue (RGB)
- Secondary color = color made by mixing two primary colors; cyan, yellow, magenta (CMY)
- Tertiary color = color made by mixing a primary and secondary color; violet, orange, etc.



Complimentary Colors & More

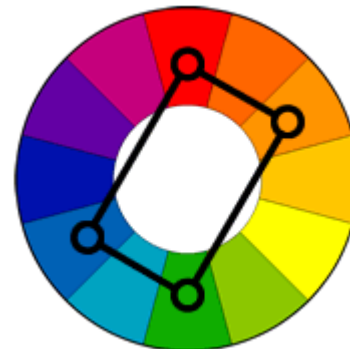
- Complimentary = Colors that are opposite of each other on a color wheel



- Triad = three colors evenly spaced around color wheel

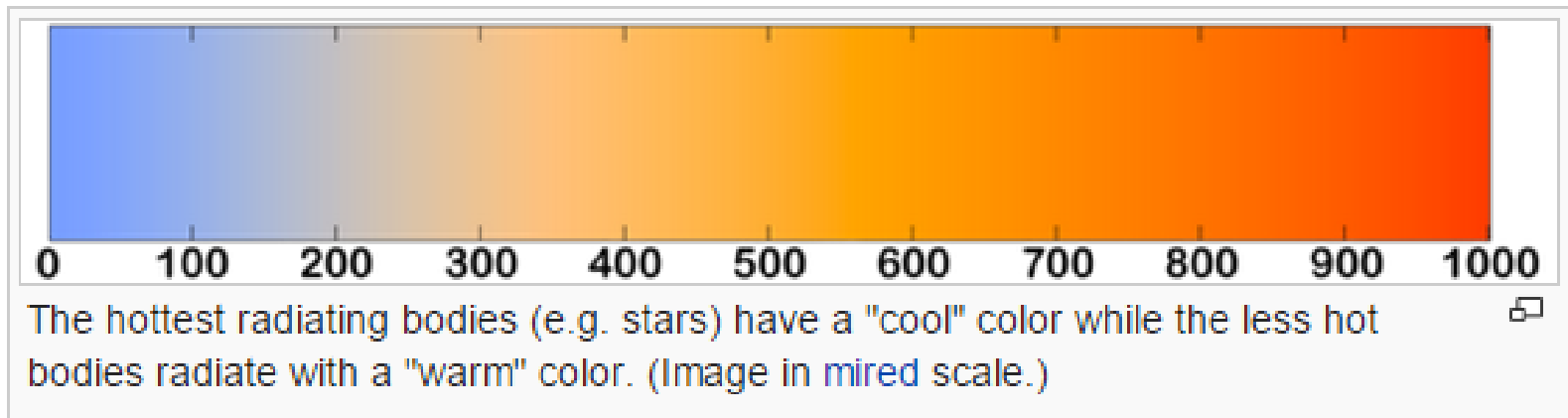


- Rectangle / Square = four colors...



Warm vs. Cool Colors

- Cool = blue or gray hue
- Warm = yellow or orange hue
